

At the Children's Scholarship Fund (CSF), we believe a quality elementary school education puts children on the path to success in life. We expand educational opportunity by providing scholarships to families in need so children can attend the K-8 schools that are the best fit, regardless of their ability to pay or where they live. We also support scholarship programs and policy reform efforts nationwide that help all children get the education they deserve.

In New York City, which is home to our headquarters, CSF is currently funding and managing the scholarships of nearly 8,300 children throughout the five boroughs. These CSF Scholars, who represent the city's rich ethnic diversity, all live at or below the federal poverty line yet their families are all paying at least \$500 towards their tuition each year. We believe this financial contribution has been key to our program's success, encouraging strong family involvement and that CSF families are fully invested and empowered in their children's education.

CSF scholarships provide children with the tools and opportunities they need to succeed and reach their full potential. In a recent survey of CSF alumni in New York who graduated eighth grade in 2009, an astounding 95.4% reported graduating from high school on time and 90% are now enrolled in colleges such as Columbia, Cornell, Fordham and New York University.

By supporting CSF, you are directly investing in these children since every dollar donated goes to scholarships, a feat that has earned CSF national recognition for fiscal responsibility and accountability.
